BANKSIA NEWS TERM 3



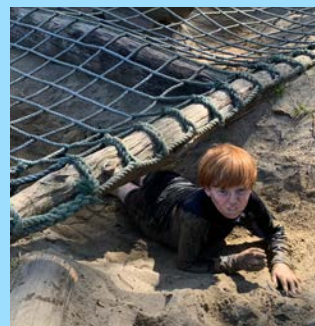

PARENT SUPPORT TO BOOST STUDENT OUTCOMES



WHAT THE RESEARCH SAYS

Parents play a crucial role in supporting their children's learning, and levels of parental engagement are consistently associated with better academic outcomes (Guidance report 2019). Researchers have reported that parent-child interactions, specifically stimulating and responsive parenting practices, are important influences on a child's academic development (Committee on Early Childhood Pedagogy, 2000, Miksic 2015).

Positive attitudes towards education and school were associated with the child's increased academic performance (Rimm-Kaufman, Pianta, Cox, & Bradley, 2003).

EFFECTIVE WAYS TO SUPPORT ACADEMIC GROWTH



Know what your child is learning at school



Ask your child to explain their learning goals and what they are currently learning at school. If your child can't tell you, ask them to find out, or contact your child's teacher. Either way, being aware of what your child is working on in school means you know what level of ability and knowledge they are at, and what they need some extra help with.



Be involved



The NSW Department of Education research into best practice, encourages supportive discussions between child and parent concerning school-related matters. This includes offering assistance and guidance with homework and other school assignments. By being genuinely interested and involved in your child's education, you will build connections as you share excitement over their successes and help them work through areas of difficulty.



Have a positive attitude toward education



Reading together and displaying your child's work at home are ways to communicate that you care about what your child is learning in the classroom. Showing that you care about what they're learning helps reinforce the importance of it.

If you consistently express a positive attitude about education and teachers, your child is more likely to see school and learning in a positive way and as important. Young children, in particular, are still forming their thoughts and feelings toward school—so do what you can to reinforce the positive and build them up as they work through any struggles.

We are so lucky here at Krambach PS to have such attentive parents. By continuing to support your child/children at home you are building confidence in what they are being taught at school and are giving them the best chance at reaching their full potential.

MRS DURBIN'S GROUPS

Animation mania has hit Krumbach PS.

Our clever 3-6 students all attended workshops in our new learning hub, working with Mrs D learning how to create their very own stop motion animations. Due to sickness it took a few weeks to ensure as many students as possible tried their hand at animation.

From these workshops several students continued developing their animation skills in Stop Motion and have started learning how to use FlipaClip. Stop Motion Studio allows students to turn a collection of images and audio into videos. FlipaClip brings student drawings to life. Both animation platforms require students to create their own story and make or draw their own scenes and characters. Students must then have the patience and drive to carefully move and slightly adjust their work repeatedly to create their animations.

Our art group have been learning about endangered Australian species and how other artists portray them in order to choose their subject for this year's Wild at Art competition. Students researched their chosen species and carefully collected photos that would help them when creating their art.

Students became art critics, critiquing art in order to identify how other artists use elements of art including line, shape, texture, form, space, colour and value to create interesting and unique art. After mapping out a rough design and considering the materials they will use, the group are currently sketching their work.
